INTRODUCTION

AIIMS Raipur is one of the new apex healthcare institutes established by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India under the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojna (PMSSY) on the pattern of AIIMS, New Delhi. The Institute has been established with the aim of correcting regional imbalances in quality tertiary level healthcare in the region and attaining self sufficiency in graduate and postgraduate medical education and training in this hitherto under-served area of the country.

MISSION STATEMENT

To establish a centre of excellence in medical education, training, health care and research imbued with scientific culture, compassion for the sick and commitment to serve the under-served. A mission to bestow world class services to the people of Chhattisgarh and surrounding areas in particular and the nation in the broader aspect.

The logo of AIIMS Raipur is amalgamated with the Sanskrit words "आरोग्यम् सुख सम्पदा" which translates into "Health, Happiness and Prosperity" thus linking health with happiness and prosperity.

MEDICAL AND NURSING COLLEGES

All the pre-clinical and para-clinical departments of the Medical College viz. Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Pathology, Microbiology, Pharmacology, Forensic Medicine & Toxicology and Community & Family Medicine are functional and located in their respective earmarked spaces. The College of Nursing has started functioning in its own building near Medical College since November, 2015.



DIRECTOR'S REVIEW



It is an honour for me to present the 7th Annual Report and the Audited Statement of Accounts of AIIMS, Raipur, for Financial year 2018-19. It is very heartening to mention that various developmental activities have been successfully completed during this Financial year.

One of the highlights on the Academic front is the approval of the Academic Committee for starting PhD course, Post Doctoral Certificate Courses, Master of Public Health, Paramedical Courses (B.Sc. in Operation Theatre Technology, B.Sc. in Medical Technology in Radiography, Bachelor in Audiology and Speech Language Pathology, Laboratory Technology, B.Sc. in Medical Advanced Diploma in Radiotherapy Technology and Certificate course in Pre-Hospital Trauma Technician) from July 2019 session. Approval for starting DM/MCh courses in various departments has also been accorded along with increase in MD/MS seats from 71 to 92 and enhancing M.Sc. Nursing (Psychiatry) seats from 2 seats to 4 seats per annum.

Two batches of MBBS (2012 and 2013) and B.Sc. (Hons.) Nursing (2013 and 2014) have successfully completed the course. Third batch of MBBS students (2014) is undergoing One year compulsory rotatory internship. It gives immense satisfaction to see that the MBBS graduates of this institute are pursuing postgraduate courses in prestigious institutions like AIIMS New Delhi, JIPMER Puducherry, PGIMER Chandigarh, Seth G.S. Medical College and others.

With an aim to give the students exposure and also to make them job ready, we have offered contractual appointments for 11 months in AIIMS Raipur itself to our students of B.Sc. (Hons.) Nursing.

This year has witnessed substantial addition of manpower – regular as well as contractual and outsourced. Recruitment processes of the past years have been completed and fresh recruitment drives were initiated. Recruitment to 183 faculty posts was also initiated and it is being done in a phased manner. Besides this, recruitment of Senior Residents and Junior Residents was done at regular intervals.

Super-specialty departments Cardiology and Cardiothoracic and Vascular Surgery, Neurosurgery as well as AYUSH department were made functional. 24x7 Trauma and Emergency Services have also been operationalized at the institute and will be scaled up in near future. The hospital, with bed strength of 600, has added a number of patient centric services like MRI (3T), DSA, OPG, Mammography, digital fluoroscopy, Linear Accelerator & CT simulator, SPECT-CT, thyroid probe (first in the state), Integrated Counseling and Testing Centre Unit (ICTC). The hospital has 18 functional state-of-the-art modular Operation Theatres and planned to be increased to 30 in near future. Various Major and Minor surgeries are being performed on a routine basis. The hospital has functional ICU, HDU.

Ayushman Bharat - Pradhanmantri Jan Aarogya Yojana, a flagship scheme of Government of India, has been implemented at AIIMS Raipur since 01.11.2018. The quantum jump in the number of OPD/IPD patients is a testimony to the efforts put in by the faculty and staff of AIIMS Raipur.

The institute continued to provide Telemedicine services for providing healthcare advice to people of Left Wing Extremism (LWE) affected areas of Chhattisgarh. Many outreach programs in the community were conducted by various departments.

Construction of C/C1 and D/D1 Blocks of the hospital has been completed and will be made fully functional soon. Other civil works like Auditorium, STP, ETP are in an advanced stage of construction. Sanction has been obtained for construction of an Academic Block and an Administrative Block for the Institute, which shall commence in the near future. Extramural as well as Intramural research activities, ICMR-STS projects are also undertaken by various departments. During the year 09 Extramural, 29 Intramural and 89 Academic projects including 11 ICMR-STS projects have been approved.

In between all the above activities, 2nd edition of ORIANA 2018, a colorful Inter-college cultural event in October 2018 students of AIIMS Raipur brought a welcome and an entertaining break. The gala event saw students from colleges across India participating in large numbers and this event received accolades from all over.

All these achievements would not have been possible without the support of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India and the people of Chhattisgarh, for whom the Institute remains committed to serve. The institute definitely would take big strides in matters of medical education, healthcare delivery, research and healthcare innovation, living up to its name of being an Institute of National Importance.

We remain committed to make AIIMS Raipur a world class institution which will continue to serve the masses.

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ACADEMIC CUM EXAMINATION SECTION

The Academic-cum-Examination Section was set up in April 2013. Dr. S P Dhaneria and Dr Krishnadutt Chavali are Dean (Academics) and Sub Dean (Academics), respectively.

Dr. Nitin Gaikwad, Additional Professor, Department of Pharmacology has been given the additional charge of Registrar from 09.11.2018 onwards.

The Section has been entrusted with the responsibility of all Academic matters pertaining to the students and faculty of the institute as also examination work of the students admitted to the institute.

MBBS and B.Sc. (Hons) Nursing courses are being run since 2012 and 2013, respectively. The postgraduate courses (MD/MS) have been started from July 2017 with annual intake of 35 seats which was increased to 71 seats per annum in July 2018. M.Sc. Nursing (Psychiatric) was started from July 2018 onwards with annual intake of 2 seats. Till January 2019 session, a total of 80 students are studying in different postgraduate courses and two (02) students in M.Sc. Nursing (Psychiatric) course. The Academic Committee of AIIMS Raipur has approved the proposal of enhancement of 21 seats in MD/MS courses and two (02) seats in Psychiatric Nursing for M.Sc. Nursing Course in its 4th meeting held on 11.03.2019 at NITI Aayog, New Delhi. Thus, from July 2019 session onwards, total PG (MD/MS) seats will be 92 and M.Sc. Nursing (Psychiatric) will be four (04) seats per annum.

In addition, the Academic Committee also approved the following courses:

1. Superspeciality courses - DM (Clinical Pharmacology), DM (Pulmonary Medicine)

and M.Ch. (Pediatric Surgery) – 2 seats per annum for each course.

- PhD courses (Physiology and Nuclear Medicine) – 2 seats per annum for each course.
- Post Doctoral Certificate Courses Anaesthesiology (Neurosurgical Anaesthesia, Critical Care – 2 seats per annum for each course), Radiodiagnosis (Cardiothoracic and Vascular Imaging and Interventional Radiology - 2 seats per annum). Paediatrics (Paediatric Critical Care, Neonatology – 4 seats per annum for each course).
- 4. Master of Public Health (MPH) 6 seats per annum.
- 5. Paramedical Courses
 - a. B.Sc. in Operation Theatre Technology 8 seats per annum.
 - b. B.Sc. in Medical Technology in Radiography 5 seats per annum.
 - c. Bachelor in Audiology and Speech Language Pathology- 4 seats per annum.
 - d. B.Sc. in Medical Laboratory Technology– 8 seats per annum.
 - e. Advanced Diploma in Radiotherapy Technology – 2 seats per annum.
- 6. Certificate course in Pre-Hospital Trauma Technician 10 seats per annum.

Major Initiatives Taken by Rajbhasha Cell during FY 2018-19

- 1. Quarterly meetings of Rajbhasha Committee were held on 30 May, 29 September, 12 December, 2018 and on 19 February, 2019. Prof. (Dr.) Nitin M. HIGHLIGHTS

The department of Anaesthesiology is providing routine anesthesia, regional analgesia, and monitored anaesthesia care in nine major operation theatres for performing routine surgical procedures of various departments. Additionally, department the provides anaesthesia to the patients undergoing CT and MR imaging under sedation / anaesthesia, procedures in DSA laboratory, and ultrasound guided procedures. The department also provide technical expertise and support to the patients admitted to trauma and emergency ward and high dependency unit needing endotracheal intubation, peripheral and central venous cannulation, etc.

The department is managing a 16 bedded critical care unit wherein neurosurgical, cardiothoracic and vascular surgery patients, and patients of urology, general surgery, ENT, gynaecology and obstetrics etc. are clinically managed.

The department is also conducting basic life support and advance cardiac life support training for undergraduates, nursing students and nursing staffs and others.

EDUCATION

The department is associated with teaching of undergraduate students (MBBS), interns, postgraduate students (MD Anaesthesiology) as well as teaching and training of senior residents in scientific practice of clinical anaesthesia and management of patients in critical care and pain management. The department is planning to start post-doctoral certificate courses (PDCC) in Neurosurgical anaesthesia and Critical care from July 2019, the PDCC courses has been approved by the academic committee of the institute.





IMAGE 1: Coronary angiogram of a patient admitted with retrosternal chest discomfort showing critical stenosis in RCA (99% stenosis)

Department of Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery is providing OPD, IPD as well as 24x7 days emergency services. We are performing all adult cardiac surgeries (like Valve replacement, Tetralogy of fallot, Acynotic congenital heart disease, Aortic root enlargement, Coronary artery bypass grafting),Thoracic and Vascular surgeries (like Decortication, Lung resections, chest wall and lung tumour resection aneurysmal repair, bypass grafting, AV fistula construction, emergency embolectomy). Department is soon starting with minimal invasive cardio-thoracic surgeries, RFA ablation procedures. This UHTC of AIIMS Raipur started its functioning on 01.08.2018.

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for establishing Rural Health Training Centre (RHTC) of AIIMS Raipur at Kurud was signed by Smt. Niharika Barik Singh, Health Secratary, Government of Chhattisgarh and Prof. (Dr.) Nitin M. Nagarkar, Director, AIIMS Raipur on 24.09.2018.

Rural Health Training Centre of AIIMS Raipur at Kurud was inaugurated on 03.10.2018 at the hands of former Health Minister, Chhattisgarh in the presence of the Director, AIIMS Raipur, DDA and entire Team of CFM.

To observe Theme of the World Health Day 2018 'Universal Health Coverage: Everyone, Everywhere' ; known patients of Hypertension and Diabetes Mellitus from Urban Field Practice Area were brought to AIIMS Raipur Hospital for check-up and were followed up subsequently for Pharmacological and non- Pharmacological compliance. Interns posted in CFM were tied up one each with these patients with an objective of adopting that patient for 3 months during posting of intern so as to achieve medicine compliance as well as lifestyle modification. CFM Department daily runs Immunization Clinic, Maternal & Child Health Clinic, Lifestyle Modification Clinic and Yellow Fever Vaccination Centre of AIIMS Raipur on every working Wednesday.

During 1.04.2018 to 31.03.2019, total 6489 under fives and 395 travellers were vaccinated. Newly admitted Medical and Nursing students (total 597 doses given) as well as health care workers (total 418 doses given) of AIIMS Raipur were vaccinated against Hepatitis B.

During MR campaign carried out from 6.10.2018 to 27.12.2018 at Immunization Clinic, 982 beneficiaries were vaccinated. Also 170 under fives were benefitted due to Pulse Polio on 10.03.2019.

Urban Health Training Centre of AIIMS Raipur located at Community Hall, Bhavani Nagar, Raipur; started its functioning on 1.08.2018. Special Clinics, ANC and NCD started on 1.02.2019. Total OPD attendance till 31.03.2019 was 3150.

AWARDS, HONOURS AND SIGNIFICANT EVENTS SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

Rashtriya Poshan Maah 2018 observed under Anemia Mukt Bharat:

Under the purview of observing Rashtriya Poshan Maah the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare had requested the National Centre of Excellence and Advanced Research on Anemia Control (NCEAR-A) at Centre for Community Medicine AIIMS, New Delhi to plan and implement Test & Treat Camps and Behaviour Change Communication (BCC) activities under Anemia Mukt Bharat strategy. These activities were to be conducted at Field Practice Areas of all AIIMS with support from respective State Health Mission in the month of September 2018.

Accordingly CFM Department conducted Test and Treat camps in all Anganwadi Centres at Urban and Rural Field Practice Areas of AIIMS, Raipur. The beneficiaries were under five children, pregnant & lactating mothers and all other females aged 15 years & above. Haemoglobin (Hb) level was estimated using HemoCue Haemoglobinometer and Iron Folic Acid tablets were given according to Hb level and age. Total 2628 beneficiaries were screened in these camps, out of which 1314 (50%) were found to be anemic.

BCC activities were conducted in three sessions at various schools in Urban and Rural Field Practice Areas of AIIMS, Raipur. In first session, using power point presentation students were taught about causes of Iron Deficiency Anemia, its symptoms & signs, and proper dietary modification to prevent the same. In second session, students were told about iron rich foods using the diet charts. Third was the concluding question-answer session clearing student's doubts regarding Iron Deficiency Anemia. Total 2133 school children enthusiastically participated in these highly interactive BCC activities.

Verbal Autopsy Training of SRS Supervisors under MINErVA:

The Office of Registrar General of India (ORGI) has signed MoU with AIIMS, New Delhi in March 2017 to establish a reliable system to measure Causes of Deaths in India. AIIMS Technical Support Unit (ATSU) is a resource unit at AIIMS New Delhi to provide any kind of technical assistance to RGI's Office in conduct of the Verbal Autopsy (VA) based Cause of Death Ascertainment under the Sample Registration System (SRS). ATSU has identified and established a network with institutions and individuals for physician coding of death based on the VA carried out by SRS staff.

AIIMS Raipur is the identified partner Institution for the state of Chhattisgarh. The faculties and residents of the CFM Department, AIIMS Raipur are involved in this Mortality in India Established through Verbal Autopsy (MINErVA) Network for coding the cause of death. The department was entrusted with the responsibility of imparting 2 days modular training on Verbal Autopsy to all SRS supervisors of Chhattisgarh working under Directorate of Census Operations (DCO), Raipur. Accordingly, the training was conducted on 29.01.2019 and 30.01.2019 at training hall of the DCO, New Rajendra Nagar, Raipur.

Professor Dr. Manisha Ruikar and Dr. Anjan Kumar Giri imparted the training. On the second day of training all the trainees were taken to a rural SRS unit (Bendri village in Abhanpur block) and urban SRS unit (Chhattisgarh Nagar, Raipur) for field demonstration of VA. Voluntary and active participation of Mr. Sisu Kumar, Joint Director, DCO Raipur throughout the training deserves a special mention.

HIGHLIGHTS

Department of Dental Surgery runs three dental chairs at present from temporary premises in Ayush block to offer daily outpatient oral care services. Maxillofacial surgical treatmentrequirements of inpatients as well as referrals for oral-dentalmaxillofacial complaints in admitted patients are attended to. Dentistry department won the Hand Hygiene award in June 2018 and December 2018 for maximum compliance with infection control among Procedure Rooms.

HIGHLIGHTS

Over the last one year, the department of Physiology has been conducting MBBS, MD and BSc Nursing classes and assessments regularly using modern structured tools. A national workshop on Assessment Methodologies which are being undertaken by the department was conducted with enthusiastic participation from twelve medical colleges of five states. In addition, sensitisation of in-house faculty regarding various teaching methods and designing of new MBBS Curriculum were addressed by departmental faculty as a part of Medical Education Unit as well as in National Conference in Medical Education. The department is involved in extensive research, as being carried

out by undergraduates (ICMR-STS), post-graduates (MD thesis) and faculty through funded/non funded intramural and extramural projects. In addition, faculty is acting as Co-guide for PhD thesis from local university and also, Post Doctoral Fellow is working under faculty. Patient care and research is ongoing routinely at AFT & Vascular Function laboratory and also, referred patients mainly from Paediatrics clinic are investigated in the EMG-NCS-EP laboratory on case to case basis. The faculty also imparted technical training to students from NIT, Raipur and also to faculty from both within and outside AIIMS on teaching & assessment methods, as aforesaid.

- Provision for March Salary has been made in current financial year.
- With reference to note no A.1.1.3, rectification entries have been made and effect being shown in current financial statements.
- With reference to not no. B.1.1, accounting policy as followed by AIIMS, Raipur is that the expenditure are booked only after sanctioning by competent authority.

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) Raipur, Chhattisgarh as at 31 March 2019, the Income and Expenditure Account and the Receipt and Payment Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers and Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 18(2) of the AIIMS Act, 1956 and the AIIMS (amendment) Act, 2012. These financial statements are the responsibility of the AIIMS's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc.; if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG's Audit Reports separately.

3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis of our opinion.

4. Based on our audit, we report that-

(i) We have obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;

(ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format approved by the Ministry of Finance, Government of India.

(iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts as required under section 18(1) of the AIIMS Act, 1956 and other relevant records have been maintained by the AIIMS Raipur in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.

(iv) We further report that:-

A. General

- Unspent balance of GIA including interest on GIA has been accounted for as Corpus/Capital Fund instead of Current Liability, which needs rectification.
- The Institute has not made the provision of Retirement Benefits on actuarial basis which is in contravention of AS 15 as well as Uniform Format of Accounts.
- B. Grant-in-aid

During the year, AIIMS, Raipur received grant-in-aid (GIA) of ₹ 121.37 crore and interest received amounting to ₹ 11.45 crore along with internal receipt of ₹ 5.84 crore. In addition to this, there was an unspent balance of ₹ 251.84 crore and unadjusted advance of ₹ 0.81 crore of previous years. Thus out of the total available funds of ₹ 391.31 crore, an amount of ₹ 265.99 crore was utilized leaving an unutilized balance of ₹ 125.32 crore. Unspent balance of GIA includes ₹ 55.57 crore up to March 2019 as interest on GIA. Also there is a difference of ₹ 12.15 crore as per Utilising details and supporting documents which needs to be reconciled.

There was also unadjusted advance of \gtrless 5.27 crore which should be included in the Untulised grants.

- (v) Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and the Receipts and Payments Account was dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- (vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the

accounting policies and Notes on Accounts and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India.
