

The Institute has been established with the aim of correcting regional imbalances in quality tertiary level healthcare in the region and attaining self sufficiency in graduate and postgraduate medical education and training in this hitherto under-served area of the country.



DIRECTOR'S REVIEW



The year 2020-21 was full of challenges and testimonies for every healthcare institution, including ours due to COVID-19 pandemic. Dedicated doctors, nursing staff, post-graduates, interns and other hospital staff of AIIMS Raipur worked as a team to offer best healthcare services to COVID patients and saved many lives. While presenting the 9th Annual Report and the Audited Statement of Accounts of AIIMS Raipur for the Financial Year 2020-21, I am immensely satisfied that the institute played a pivotal role in COVID-19 management in Chhattisgarh State.

The institute has made significant academic progress and has grown into an 'Academic Tree,' offering graduation, post-graduation, super specialisation and specialised training courses. Since inception of this institute in 2012, nine batches of MBBS and eight batches of B.Sc. (Hons.) Nursing have been admitted. From the Academic Year 2020 onwards, number of seats in MBBS and B.Sc. (Hons). Nursing Course were increased from 100 to 125 and 60 to 75, respectively, after implementation of EWS quota.

Since the start of postgraduate courses in July 2017, the annual intake was increased gradually with enhancement of faculty strength, patient care and diagnostic services. After receiving approval from the institute's Academic Committee, the institute started

new PG courses such as MD Emergency Medicine, MD PMR, and MDS in Paediatric Dentistry in 2020-21, taking its total annual intake of MD/MS/MDS seats to 141. The institute is providing 14 super speciality courses like DM/MCh with 29 seats per annum. Similarly, the institute has also opened academic avenue for post-PG students to pursue specialized training through seven Post-doctoral Certificate Courses (PDCC) in various departments.

Four batches of MBBS (2012, 2013, 2014, 2015) have completed their internship and four batches of B. Sc. (Hons.) Nursing (2013, 2014, 2015, 2016) have completed their course. It is worth mentioning here that the graduates of AIIMS Raipur are pursuing their post-graduation in reputed medical institutions of India. Few of our graduates are pursuing their further studies in foreign universities. The institute offers 11-month contractual appointments to our B.Sc. (Hons.) Nursing students. The MBBS graduates of AIIMS Raipur are being preferred for the job of non-academic Junior Residents under Central Residency Scheme of Government of India.

Two batches of MD/MS/MDS (July 2017 and Jan 2018) and one batch of M.Sc. Nursing have completed their course and all the students were declared successful. Similarly, two batches of PDCC

students have finished their programme after attaining specialised training. It is notable to mention that despite the COVID – 19 pandemic, the institute completed professional examinations for final year batches of various courses on time and was able to begin internship for the MBBS 2016 batch on January 1, 2021.

The faculty and staff of all the departments of the institute worked cohesively when the our entire country was grappling with COVID-19 pandemic. Well-developed clinical and diagnostic facilities, adequate bed strength, critical care facilities, well-defined infrastructure and most importantly doctors and nursing staff with specialized training enabled AIIMS Raipur take a leadership role in the state. With the coordination and support from Chhattisgarh Government, the institute had prepared a road-map to tackle this public health emergency.

At the time of outbreak, only AIIMS Raipur had a functional State Level Virus Research and Diagnostic Laboratory (VRDL) and accordingly all RTPCR tests were conducted in our lab. Subsequently, AIIMS Raipur under the able guidance of ICMR has taken the lead in guiding the State Governments to start their own testing laboratories and training their manpower in the States of Chhattisgarh and Jharkhand. Virology Laboratory work at our institute was supported with human resource provided by the State Government and as a result, in 2020-21, the institute could perform 2,16,506 RT-PCR tests. A total of 500 beds were made available by the institute for COVID patients. The institute provided 24 X 7 emergency services during COVID- 19 pandemic. On an average, daily 15 faculty members from Pre-, Para- and Clinical departments, 25 SRs and JRs, 10 Interns and 40 Nursing Officers were posted on rotation basis for screening and management of COVID patients. This determination and team work resulted in successful treatment and discharge of 7089 COVID-19 positive patients. Continuous training of healthcare professionals on infection prevention and control aspects and on COVID-19 management by Hospital Infection Control Committee and COVID-19 Management committee,

respectively, facilitated the patient care services. The institute was well-prepared with its dedicated vaccination team for the Pan-India roll out of COVID – 19 vaccination on January 16, 2021. Till 31st March 2021, a total of 8184 doses of COVID vaccine were administered.

The hospital catered services to non-COVID patients and the number of OPD and IPD patients treated were 2,67,230 and 22863 respectively. The institute also provided Telemedicine services during the lockdown period and continued to do so afterward, extending Teleconsultation benefits to 24,417 patients. A total of 9971 major and minor surgeries were performed which include 988 emergency surgeries. Similarly, 1421 deliveries were performed which include 168 COVID positive deliveries. Patient management, whether COVID or non-COVID, would not have been possible without the backend services provided by diagnostic departments. A total of 13,45,503 investigations were performed by departments of Biochemistry, Microbiology, Pathology and Radiodiagnosis. Ayushman Bharat- Pradhanmantri Jan Aarogya Yojana, a flagship scheme of Government of India, has already been implemented in our hospital, with a total of 9945 patients benefiting during the current financial year. The ARPAN scheme offers benefits to poor patients, and the institute has also established the Rogi Kalyan Samiti.

In addition, this year witnessed commencement of upgradation of services such as start of well-equipped, state-of-art BSL-III Mycobacteriology Laboratory, installation of Hospital Management and Information System, enhancement of dialysis beds, commencement of Glendoscopy and colonoscopy, upgradation of Central Sterile Supply Department (CSSD) facilities, installation of Electronic Motorized Compactor for Medical Records in Medical Record section, authorization to issue birth and death certificates and digitalization of hospital services like registration, billing and medical records.

Research is an important mandate of institutes of national importance. The institute was

part of many collaborative projects on COVID – 19 and one of the trial sites for few investigational drugs for COVID – 19. Apart from that, during this year, 51 extramural, 24 intramural, 11 ICMR-STS and 297 academic projects have been approved. The institute has functional Hospital Infection Control Committee and Antimicrobial Stewardship Committee, which are committed to achieve broader goal of reduction of antimicrobial resistance.

During the pandemic, faculty from our institute provided academic perspectives on various aspects of COVID – 19 at the state, national, and international levels via webinars and online conferences: a webinar with SAARC countries is prominent to mention. Academic activities were never compromised during pandemic time. The faculty members continued to deliver theory lectures through online platform. The practical and clinical teachings were conducted in small groups with COVID appropriate behaviour.

The institute's services provided during the pandemic drew praise and appreciation from all over

the state and country and emerged as one of the prime medical institutions in Central India. I put on record the words of appreciation for my team who are true owners of love and affection showered on us. The institute followed all the COVID related guidelines issued by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India and Chhattisgarh State Government. The massive task of combating this global pandemic was not easy; however, continued support from the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India and Chhattisgarh State Government and the general public on every aspect of COVID-19 management aided the institute to offer best services. I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude and seek continued support in the future.

We, AIIMS Raipur, as a team, are committed to achieve the epitome of academics, bring out need-based research and serve the people of Chhattisgarh and our country with best patient care.

The Section has been entrusted with the responsibility of all Academic matters pertaining to the students and faculty of the institute as also examination work of the students admitted to the institute.

MBBS and B.Sc. (Hons) Nursing courses are being run since 2012 and 2013 respectively. The postgraduate courses (MD/MS) have been started from July 2017 with annual intake of 35 seats and the Academic Committee of the Institute has approved to increase the seats from 127 to 141 seats per annum in its 6th meeting. M.Sc. Nursing

(Psychiatric) was started from July 2018 onwards with annual intake of 2 seats which was increased to 04 seats per annum from July 2019. Till January 2021 session, a total of 252 MD/MS/MDS, 16 DM/MCh students are studying in different postgraduate courses and 7 students in M.Sc. Nursing (Psychiatric) course. In addition, Ph.D., PDCC, Master of Public Health, Paramedical courses, certificate course and super specialty courses are being run in the Institute.

The General Administration, including Personnel and Establishment, Security, Estate, matters related to Engineering Services Department, Stores, Public Relations activities and Rajbhasha Department of the Institute are controlled and supervised by the Deputy Director (Administration). - 3. AIIMS Raipur is an important member of Departmental Official Language Implementation Committee. Half-yearly meeting of the committee was organized in the form of webinar on 22 october,2020 under the chairmanship of Shri Shyam Sundar Gupta, Divisional Rail Manager, South-East Central Railway, Raipur. About the Hospital:

OPD SERVICES

Multi-specialty OPD services including Medicine, Cardiology, Surgery, Gynaecology & Obstetrics, Paediatrics, Pulmonary Medicine, Orthopaedics, ENT, Ophthalmology, Dermatology, Psychiatry, Dentistry, Paediatric Surgery, Burns & Plastic Surgery, Nephrology, CTVS, Ayurveda, Physiotherapy, Diet, Clinic, Neurosurgery, Nuclear Medicine, Physical, Medicine & Rehabilitation (PMR), Neurology are functioning regularly. Online OPD registration facility (ORS) is available for ease of patient registration. During this period ending by March-2021, 2,67,230 patients attended various OPD services of the institute.

INDOOR SERVICES:

The indoor patient departments (IPD) of the hospital are located in the Block-1(A – A1), Trauma Centre and AYUSH & PMR building. The total number of beds and operation theatres planned for the hospital is 960. Total of 900 beds are functional as of now. The beds are used by the patients of all OPD departments running at AIIMS Raipur. Four Modular operation Theatres and one minor operation theatre are fully functional. The operating facilities are available for Burns & Plastic Surgery, CTVS, Dentistry, ENT, General Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Ophthalmology, Orthopaedics, Paediatrics Surgery and Neurosurgery.

DIAGNOSTIC SERVICES:

X-ray, ultrasound, 128-slice CT scan, 256-slice CT scan, DSA lab, Ultrasound machines, OPG machine, Mammography machine, CR and DR, Clinical Biochemistry, Pathology, and Microbiology investigations, Cath-Lab Angiography, MRI are available round the clock within the hospital. Specialized audiology investigations have also been started.

In AIIMS, Raipur Department of central medical records regularly furnishes the data related to OPD, IPD, Surgery details, manpower and other activities of AIIMS Raipur to MoHFW. MRD also uploads its progress report on the portal of PMSSY Division regularly.

The department introduced NIC (HMIS) & ORS (Online Registration System) since 18/10/2016 & 01.07.2019 and also introduced (C-DAC) software. Medical Records Department has a centralized system for preserving the Medical Records of In-Patients. Using the Serial Numbering System a unique number is assigned to a new patient which is called CR (Central Registration Number)/UHID Number.

Since establishment of the Department of Central Medical Records is extending its services to the Institute, patients and public.

Key Role Services of the Department of Central Medical Records:-

- 1. Electronic Medical Record (EMR) / Electronic Health Record (EHR).
- 2. Digitalization of Medical Records.
- 3. Installed state of the art Electronic Motorized Compactor for Medical Records.
- 4. Authorized to issue Birth and Death Certificates.
- 5. Maintained all records/Medico-Legal Cases as per norms.
- 6. Medical Audit and Statistical Studies.
- 7. Conducted CMEs for awareness of Medical Records.
- 8. Online facilitation for Registration, Billing etc.
- 9. Facilitate Insurance Claims.

The Department has extended following services/facilities in the Financial Year 2020-21:

- 1. Facilitated registration, billing etc. to 2,67,147 patients in OPD during pandemic.
- 2. Facilitated admission of 22,863 patients in IPD and their record keeping during pandemic.
- 3. Facilitated admission of 8,786 patient's surgeries (Major & Minor) and their record keeping during pandemic.
- 4. Facilitated admission of 11,559 COVID 19 patients, 1421 deliveries and 168 COVID 19 positive deliveries during pandemic and their record keeping.

While health systems around the world are being challenged by increasing demand for care of COVID-19 patients, it is critical to maintain preventive and curative services, especially for the most vulnerable populations, such as children, older persons, people living with chronic conditions, minorities and people living with disabilities. In the face of the daunting health crisis, AIIMS Raipur demonstrated its commitment to the people by working to alleviate suffering and improve health and well-being for all through service, discovery, scholarship, and leadership. AIIMS Raipur initiated work to provide quality care to those affected by COVID-19 while simultaneously launching efforts to understand the nature of SARS-CoV-2 and develop containment and management strategies.

AllMS Raipur faculty with extensive experience in combating infectious disease outbreaks, identified the need for broader testing capabilities, more personal protective equipment for health care providers and greater hospital capacity. AllMS Raipur also set up a task force to develop a management protocol for COVID-19 and constituted several committees to respond to various challenges posed by the pandemic. The institute also partnered with other institutions to help guide containment efforts through screening, rapid testing and prevention. The institute produced COVID-19 informational resources for the public in multiple languages.

In a very short span of time, AIIMS, Raipur faculty members successfully helped design, staff and lead the COVID clinical response in India by converting the AYUSH and C block of main Hospital building 500 beds (more than 100 Intensive Care/High Dependency Unit beds) into a dedicated COVID-19 hospital. The team consisted of faculty members, residents, interns, nursing and all other support staff.

The education programs at the institute were rapidly calibrated to provide the best learning experiences possible under the circumstances while protecting the health of the entire community. Faculty members, students and staff moved swiftly to remote learning and off-site work using new pedagogical approaches.

AIIMS Raipur was also instrumental in capacity building for handling COVID 19 in the state by ensuring training of health care staff including doctors, nurses, paramedics and Laboratory technicians.

AllMS Raipur also provided exemplary leadership in the region and country in controlling the pandemic by conducting webinars for SAARC countries for handling and managing COVID19; it also helped in developing protocols and developing guidelines for the state to handle the pandemic effectively. Faculties of AllMS Raipur were members of various taskforces in the country for developing guidance documents for handling COVID19 effectively.

Patient movement and admission in the state was effectively controlled by AIIMS in coordination with state administration in an exemplary manner that there was no shortage of beds or oxygen in the state.

AIIMS Raipur VRDL lab is acting as the lifeline for the state and central India conducting more than 2,16,506 tests of which 22136 were tested positive. AIIMS performed a key role in helping establish a network of 17 laboratories capable of RTPCR testing in Chhattisgarh and Jharkhand. In Chhattisgarh, 12 laboratories comprising of 5 government medical colleges, 3 private medical college and 4 stand-alone laboratories or in corporate hospitals. In Jharkhand, 5 labs were established; four in government medical colleges and one in district (sadar) hospital.

AIIMS Raipur is also involved in Inter laboratory Quality Control program for testing quality of RT PCR tests being performed at the newly established labs. In the F.Y 2020-2021, 12 labs were enrolled in the ILQC program. Labs showing less than 90% concordance were contacted, gap analysis and repeat hand holding was done. Repeat ILQC was done for such Labs.

During this period 7495 patients with COVID 19 were admitted and 7089 patients were discharged. More

than 350 children suffering from COVID and its complications were also treated successfully.

A total of 115 research projects were conducted on COVID during this tenure. Of these, 32 projects were funded by various national and international extramural agencies.

AIIMS Raipur, with the support and guidance of MoHFW, (GoI), ICMR and State Govt. will continue to provide best services during this pandemic.

HIGHLIGHTS

The department of anaesthesiology is providing routine Anesthesia, regional Analgesia and monitored anaesthesia care in nine major operation theaters for performing routine surgical procedures of various departments including General Surgery, Orthopedic Surgery, ENT, Dental Surgery, Ophthalmology, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, and super specialty departments including Cardiothoracic Surgery, Neurosurgery, Plastic Surgery, Urology and Paediatric Surgery. Additionally, the department provides Anaesthesia to the patients undergoing CT and MR imaging under sedation / Anaesthesia, procedures in DSA laboratory, and ultrasound guided procedures. The department also provides technical expertise and support to the patients admitted to Trauma and Emergency ward and high dependency unit needing Endotracheal intubation, peripheral and Central Venous Cannulation, etc.

The department is managing a 16 bedded Critical Care Unit wherein Neurosurgical, Cardiothoracic and Vascular Surgery patients, and patients of Urology, General Surgery, ENT, ECT, Gynaecology and Obstetrics, COVID 19 & Mucormycosis are clinically

managed. The Critical Care includes intensive monitoring, Ventilatory and Respiratory support, Hemodynamic support, Acute Renal failure, Nutritional support, and routine management of postsurgical patients. The department screens patients scheduled for Surgery in pre Anesthesia check-up Clinic.

The department runs a Pain and Palliative Care service 24*7 for Chronic and Acute Pain. Pain clinic OPD runs every day. Interventional pain procedures are done in OT. The department is running post graduate MD Anaesthesiology program. The department is also conducting basic life support and advance cardiac life support training for undergraduates, Nursing students and Nursing staffs and others. Various faculties of the department have taken part in different regional and national conferences as faculties. In addition to departmental responsibilities, the department has provided expertise in installation and commissioning of 24 modular operation theaters, gas plant room, liquid medical oxygen plant, and medical gas pipeline system in various designated areas of the hospital.

EDUCATION

The department is associated with teaching of undergraduate students (MBBS), interns, postgraduate students (MD Anaesthesiology) as well as teaching and training of senior residents in scientific practice of clinical anaesthesia, and management of patients in critical care and pain management. Education program for postgraduate and senior residents includes seminars, didactic lectures, case presentation and discussions, journal club, science of monitoring, management of complications in day to day (routine) emergency surgeries, etc. The department has started the post-doctoral certificate courses (PDCC) in :-

HIGHLIGHTS

The Department is dedicated to patient care and is involved in innovation and research. Major reconstructive surgeries to restore form and function after head and neck malignancy extirpation are routinely done in collaboration with the Department of ENT and Head Neck Surgery. The Department contributed significantly to the reconstruction of defects and deformities due to malignancy, congenital or acquired as referred from other surgical departments or as a part of the team in collaboration with the other surgical departments. Major limb defects reconstruction are done in limb trauma cases by the department and in collaboration with the Orthopedics, department to restore the form and function of the limbs. Last year, three patients with Mullerian agenesis were operated & vaginal reconstruction was done with the Gynecology team to restore female genitalia and their function. In collaboration with general surgery and Pediatric Surgery department, complicated wound management and reconstruction are routinely done. Major chest wall reconstruction surgeries were done for thoracictumor resection defects in collaboration with the CTVS department.

Reconstruction of wide range of the congenital and acquired defects and deformity of the body are being undertaken routinely. Skin and soft tissue malignancies are treated by tumor excision followed

by reconstruction. Microsurgical procedures like free tissue transfer; repair of nerve and vessel injuries, Brachial Plexus Surgery and creation of AV fistula in chronic renal disease patientsare being routinely done. Corrective surgeries and rehabilitation of post burn deformity, post burn scarring and post leprosy limb deformity are done. Pediatric Congenital anomalies like syndactyly, polydactyly, hypospadias, cleft lip-palate, club hand is routinely being corrected. Aesthetic Surgeries like breast reduction, gynecomastiacorrection, and scar revision are being routinely done. Minor surgical procedure room has been set up in the outpatient department; where procedures like scar revision, benign skin and adnexal tumor excision, skin grafting, finger and hand injury management are being done on day care basis routinely.

Despite the constrained situation due to the ongoing pandemic, the Department has managed to do 29 major cancer reconstruction surgeries in head and neck cancer cases in last one year. A total of 172 major and 51 minor surgeries were done since the first national lockdown was announced last year.

Establishment of a dedicated 12 bedded Burn unit with state-of-the-art facilities, HDU and dedicated Burn OT has been approved for care of acute burn patients.

- Teaching and training of Post graduateresidents of General Surgery, posted to the Department on rotation basis.
- 2. Teaching of the Junior & Senior Residents from different surgical Departments with whom the reconstructive surgeries are undertaken in collaboration.
- 3. Teaching of paramedical staffs and Pre-Trauma Technician trainees (PTT) Admission for One M.Ch. Superspecialist seat per session has been approved from July 2020 Onwards.

HIGHLIGHTS

The Department of Cardiology provided 7303 OPD consultations in the year 2020-21 (April 1, 2020 – March 31, 2021). In the current financial year, 236 invasive cardiac procedures were performed in cardiac catheterization lab (202 coronary angiographies ,33 coronary angioplasties and stenting&cath study). Apart from this ,10 emergency pericardiocentesis were done in patients of massive

pericardial effusion with tamponade physiology. In the non-invasive lab, 4716ECG ,08 exercise stress test, 2975 echocardiographic studies, 03 transesophageal echocardiographic studies were conducted. Apart from the routine clinical work, the faculties and the residents of the department rendered their clinical services in COVID –ICU.

EDUCATION

The department of Cardiology is actively involved in imparting problem based and case based learning to post-graduates of our institute. Clinical teaching is imparted in the OPD, IPD, non-invasive and invasive lab. Clinical case presentation, journal club, catheterization conference, departmental seminar, cardiology-nuclear medicine meet and cardiology-radiology meet are organized to impart knowledge and skills to the students. The academic junior residents pursuing post-graduation in Department of Radiodiagnosis and Department of General Medicine were given basic echocardiographic training. The Department of Cardiology got approval from Institute's Academic Council for starting PDCC (Cardiac Critical Care) programme in January 2021. DM (Cardiology) programme – a 3-year course was initiated from September, 2020 with an annual intake of 2 students.

It has 10 bedded Coronary care unit (CCU) with state of the art central monitoring system in 4th floor of C block, and 4 bedded high dependency unit (HDU). HIGHLIGHTS

Department of Cardiovascular and Vascular Surgery is providing OPD, IPD as well as 24x7 days emergency services. The Department is performing all adult cardiac surgeries like Coronary artery bypass grafting, valve replacement, Tetralogy of Fallot, Acynotic congenital heart disease, Aortic root enlargement. Thoracic surgeries - Decortication, Lung resections, chest wall and lung tumour resection. Vascular Surgeries- aneurysmal repair, bypass grafting, AV fistula construction, emergency embolectomy. The Department has started uniportal Video-Assisted Thoracoscopic Surgery for

inflammatory as well as in Cancer cases. The Department is also providing special emergency services, particularly for Thoracic and Vascular trauma cases. Department is soon starting with minimal invasive cardiothoracic surgeries, RFA ablation procedures. The Department has a dedicated 4 bedded fully equipped step-down ICU with 25 bedded CTVS ward and one isolation room facility forthe patient. The Department has started high end, fully equipped, dedicated high-end CTVS ICU facility in the 4th floor C block.

HIGHLIGHTS

Department of Dentistry provides routine essential general-, specialist- and advanced multi-specialty dental services in both outpatient and in-patient services. The scope of treatment procedures offered in outpatient service includes routine treatments like prophylaxis, preventive andrestorative dentistry to more specialized treatments like Dental implants, Pediatric dentistry, Endodontic procedures, Prosthetic Dentistry, Orthodontics and an array of minor oral surgical procedures. The Department of Dentistry is presently equipped with four fullyfunctional dental chairs rendering continued patient care. The outpatient services of the department are envisaged for a state-of-the-art upgradation with the addition of 10 more dental chairs soon.

Apart from the outpatient services, the department of Dentistry provides in-patient services which include anentire gamut of specialized dentistry specific to pediatric patients under general anesthesia to fullfledged oral and maxillofacial surgical procedures ranging from maxillofacial trauma to oral surgical oncology and reconstructive surgeries. The residents and faculty provide round the clock coverage in trauma and emergency and patient care in dedicated wards for the in-patients, along with attending to the dental calls from various other wards for complaints ranging from general dental complaints to offering maxillofacial prostheses like obturator, feeding plates and NAM appliances in cleft patients.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the department has actively involved hand in hand with the institution in managing the COVID-19 patients in our institute in all possible capacities, which includes them being posted in the COVID screening area, in-patient wards and ICU. Also, we have operated upon COVID positive patients who required emergency services from the department. The department provides continued teleconsultation services throughout the pandemic to needy patients.

EDUCATION

- Lecture classes for MBBS students comprise oral and dental topics with clinical relevance to a medical graduate.
- Online distribution and collation of study material, and testing was introduced for the PG students in Maxillofacial surgery.
- Academic mentoring for the academic junior residents are also provided for their thesis research projects and papers and posters presented at forums such as conferences.
- A weekly academic schedule of seminars, journal clubs, case presentations and relevant summaries was implemented by the PG trainees with sessions moderated by the faculty. Academics, including classes by faculty for PGs, are conducted on all working days.
- Internal assessment examination was conducted for the postgraduate students Classes for the nursing students address oral health nursing considerations

- An introduction on World Oral Health Day on the theme "Be Proud of your Mouth" was given
- Common dental health problems, causes, Do's and Dont's, cause of Bad Breath, when to visit doctor, importance of good and bad food, brushing technique in children and adults.
- Once the session was completed the doubts of beneficiaries were cleared and feedback was asked to improve in future sessions.

HIGHLIGHTS

The Department of Otorhinolaryngology-Head & Neck Surgery is a fully functional department catering to all varieties of cases of Ear, Nose & Throat diseases, Head and Neck malignancies. Endoscopic Nasal & Skull base surgery, Thyroid & parathyroid surgery, surgery for Oral, Laryngeal and Hypopharyngeal cancers, Nasal and Paranasal sinus cancers, Pituitary surgery, Surgery for Vascular tumors- angifibroma, hemangiomas, lymphangiomas, Airway surgerysurgery for subglottic stenosis, Cochlear Implant surgery, Functional Endoscopic Sinus Surgery for nasal polyposis, Tympanomastoidectomy, Stapedectomy and surgery for Salivary gland neoplasms is being performed routinely with advanced instrumentation in state of the art Modular Operation Theatres.

Multidisciplinary management of cases is done in collaboration with Departments of Plastic surgery, Neurosurgery and Oral Maxillofacial surgery. All advanced Head and Neck cancers are discussed in the Tumor board comprising of various related departments. Atypical cases are discussed in monthly ENT- Pathology rounds and ENT — Radiology, rounds. Vertigo clinic & Otology clinic are a regular feature. Department has contributed significantly during Covid pandemic. All faculty members and residents performed duties in Covid wards. Department continued Telemedicine and Head and neck operative surgeries during Covid pandemic.

The Department has a fully equipped Audiology and Speech Language Pathology unit. BASLP course has started with 4 students in each batch: currently 2 batches are pursuing their undergraduate degree. HIGHLIGHTS

The department successfully handled all the Covid-19 bodies of the Institute and also conducted autopsies on few Covid-19 positive medicolegal cases. There has been no instance of exchange of bodies, mal-handling of dead bodies, decomposition or piling of dead bodies even at the peak of the wave. The doctors of the department also pitched in for rendering their services in the Covid areas of the hospital as decided by the Institute. Classes were held for the students in the online mode so as to minimize disruption in their studies and their examinations. It has been decided in principle that three more police station areas would be included within the medicolegal jurisdiction of the Institute and the Institute would also be recognized for medicolegal examinations and certification of cases directly brought by the police or investigation officers.

EDUCATION

The department holds teaching classes for MBBS 2nd Professional students, MD students and students of Pre Hospital Trauma Technician course. The department also has been approved to take PhD scholars. Annual intake of MD students and PhD scholars is 2 each. Efforts are underway to start DM course in Medical and Forensic Toxicology in the department.

During Covid-19 pandemic, the department continued with the online teaching for the MBBS 2nd professional batch of students and successfully conducted their exams. The department also held the practical examination of its first MD student in August 2020 and the second MD student in February 2021. Both students have been declared passed.

HIGHLIGHTS

The department of General Medicine is fully functional with regular OPD, male and female wards. The department is also providing round the clock services at trauma & emergency department. Majority of medical cases (70-80%) including the super speciality cases are admitted and treated by the General Medicine department. The department has started speciality clinics in afternoon, Rheumatology and Immunology Clinic on every

Wednesday, Geriatric clinic, and Sickle cell clinic on every Thursday. It has been planned to expand speciality clinic in other areas. The Medical ICU work is completed and it is has been made operational for patient care. Annual intake of academic residents has been enhanced to 12 from this academic year. It has been planned to start few fellowship course and super speciality courses from next academic year.

EDUCATION

The department is associated with teaching of undergraduate (MBBS), interns and postgraduate (MD General Medicine) training. With Covid pandemic, most of the MBBS training is done virtual mode. Clinical case scenarios are prepared and they are used for the virtual training. The department has trained more than 200 Assistant Medical Officers (AMO) from the Chhattisgarh on management of non-communicable disease under NPCDCS. The standards treatment protocol for Diabetes and Hypertension for the state of Chhattisgarh has been developed by department in collaboration state with NCD cell. The medical officers of state of Chhattisgarh are given training on this protocol. The department has done training of health care workers organised by National Programme for Health Care of the Elderly (NPHCE). The other training conducted hand hygiene workshop for residents.

HIGHLIGHTS

The Department offers varied open and laparoscopic surgical facilities to the patients in need of surgical care in both elective and emergency settings. The Department had high end 4K laparoscope system for carrying out minimal invasive interventions. The Department had also started upper and lower GI

diagnostic endoscopy services for the needy patients. The Department is running postgraduate course (MS General Surgery) with annual intake of the ten postgraduate students in two sessions. The Department continued its round the clock emergency services throughout the COVID period.

EDUCATION

The Department undertakes clinical teaching of undergraduate students of four semesters while students of three semesters were taught in didactic lectures. During the clinical postings the students were exposed to the nuances of surgical care offered to the patients in the various work stations like OPD, major and minor operation theatre and IPD. The students were periodically evaluated by internal assessment for knowledge gained in clinical and theoretical aspect. The department also organized hands on training program for its interns and residents for fine tuning the surgical skills. Online classes are also being held for undergraduate students to facilitate continuous learning process.

Academic activities for the postgraduate students is being conducted regularly (thrice in every week) in the form of clinical case presentations, journal clubs, topic discussions, and surgico-pathological seminars.

HIGHLIGHTS

First batch of two PG students passed MD-Microbiology Examination in January 2021. Seventh batch of MBBS students passed 2ndProfessional examination in February 2021. Five more PG students joined MD Microbiology course in January 2021. Seventh batch of BSc. Nursing students passed Microbiology in 2020. Nearly 2.5 lakh RT PCR tests for SARS-CoV-2 were conducted in the Molecular Biology laboratory of VRDL, Department of Microbiology, AIIMS Raipur from April 2020- March 2021. A state of the art Tuberculosis laboratory with BSL-3 facilitywas inaugurated on 24th March 2021 by the President of AIIMS Raipur, Dr. George D'Souza and AIIMS Raipur Dr. Nitin M Nagarkar. Mycobacteriology laboratory, AIIMS Raipur got accreditation from Central TB Division for performing Line probe assay (LPA) against the First line antitubercular drugs. Renovation work of Serology Laboratory was completed in the department. Laboratory services were imparted round the clock, including holidays with gradual increase in spectrum of available test lists, in all the fully functional diagnostic sections of

the department including Bacteriology, Serology, Tuberculosis, Mycology, Virology and Infection control. Most of the infection control activities were focused in COVID wards with repeated trainings and sensitization of all cadres of HCWs. Dedicated ICNs were posted in COVID areas of AIIMS-Raipur to monitor infection control practices of HCWs posted in these areas. Hospital infection Control Committee with the lead from Microbiology department developed recommendations and educational material for Infection control against COVID-19, implemented the onsite round the clock infection control monitoring process and provided extensive trainings on basic ICPs to more than 3000 HCWs of AIIMS-Raipur as well as of various government health care facilities of Chhattisgarh, throughout the year. All the faculty of the department received sanction of various new extra-mural and intramural research grants and continued working on their already running projects. Some research projects were also completed.

In both waves of COVID-19, the Department has managed COVID suspected and Covid positive babies in isolation area.

Department of Neonatology is also running 'Centre of

HIGHLIGHTS

The 52nd annual conference of the Society of Nuclear medicine, India was organized by the Department of Nuclear Medicine.

The organizing chairman was Dr. Karan Peepre and organizing secretary Dr. Mudalsha Ravina. HIGHLIGHTS

The hemodialysis (HD) unit in C block Basement, was inaugurated by Prof. Nitin M. Nagarkar, Director and CEO, AIIMS Raipur and Prof. Vivekanand Jha, Executive Director, The George Institute of Global Health on 10th March 2021 on the occasion of World Kidney Day. The HD unit has 18 HD Machines. A dialysis access theater is proposed for creating AV Fistula and insertion of PD Catheter in HD Unit. Nephrology Ward was inaugurated in the 3C1 block by Prof. Nagarkar, Director and Prof. Jha, on 10th

March 2021 on the occasion of World Kidney. The ward has 30 beds for treating patients with Kidney Diseases, a Peritoneal Dialysis Unit for training on Peritoneal Dialysis, and a proposed Renal Lab. Peritoneal Dialysis unit: A state of art peritoneal dialysis unit was inaugurated in the 3C1 block by Prof. Nagarkar, and Prof. Jha on 10th March 2021 on the occasion of World Kidney. The unit has 2 Automated Peritoneal Dialysis Cycler.

Ongoing Services:

Despite COVID Pandemic the Department of Nephrology continues to provide routine and Emergency services to the patients suffering from kidney ailments. The operational Hemodialysis Machine has increased from none to 20, including six hemodialysis machines operational exclusively for COVID-19 patients.

The department provides various services including Ultrasound-guided kidney Biopsy, Hemodialysis, Peritoneal dialysis facilities including CAPD, Automated Peritoneal dialysis, and Acute PD, Plasmapheresis, Hemoperfusion, CRRT, SLED, Isolated ultrafiltration. Department provides daycare facilities for Immunosuppression drugs and renal biopsy for patients with Glomerular diseases.

Special clinics

- 1) Glomerular disease clinic (GDC): The clinic run every Wednesday provides care to more than 300 patients suffering from various glomerular diseases.
- 2) **CKDu clinic**: A cluster of cases of chronic kidney disease of unknown origin has been reported from the border districts of Orissa and Chhattisgarh. Department of Nephrology runs a special clinic for these patients every Thursday. More than 150 patients are enrolled in this clinic
- 3) Preventive Nephrology Clinic: in collaboration with the School of Public Health provides preventive nephrology services

Support to Government in dealing with Chronic Kidney Disease problem in Supebeda

The Department is providing support to State Government in dealing with Kidney Diseases cases in Supebeda including conducting camps, organizing workshops for health care workers, and providing renal replacement to the patients. Department of Nephrology with the help of NHM, Chhattisgarh has been providing Peritoneal Dialysis services to patients from Supebeda. A research proposal to identify the cause of CKD has been submitted to the Government of Chhattisgarh.

Support to Government in dealing with Chronic Kidney Disease problem in Chhattisgarh

The department of Nephrology has been actively involved in supporting the state government to deal with chronic kidney disease in the state of Chhattisgarh, including training of dialysis technician and conducting seminars. A proposal for starting Peritoneal Dialysis in Chhattisgarh has also been submitted to the Government of Chhattisgarh.

EDUCATION

DM Nephrology program has started in the department of Nephrology Currently, two DM students are pursuing DM Nephrology at AlIMS, Raipur. Two Regular classes and training for Dialysis Technicians and Nursing staff.

HIGHLIGHTS

The Department of Ophthalmology is presently involved in patient care in the form of outpatient services, ophthalmic surgeries and inpatient services. It comprises of a dedicated team which caters to various types of patients with speciality services available for Glaucoma, Cornea, Oculoplasty, Orbit, Strabismus, Medical Retina and Trauma cases. Services which include Phacoemulsification and Small Incision Cataract Surgery are being provided to a large number of cataract patients who visit the OPD. This includes Paediatric cataracts as well. Department is also involved in screening of Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP) in neonatal ICU. This year saw the acquisition of Argon green LASER which would further add to the vitreoretinal services provided by the department. A Specular microscope, Laminar flow hood and Slit lamp were also procured for the development of Eye Bank services. Presently the OPD is well equipped with three slit lamps so that it can cater to a large number of patients for initial comprehensive examination. Optometry services have been further

expanded with addition of one more refraction unit setup; thus, making it to a total of three.

Patient awareness is a key point stressed upon by the Department; which has organized various programmes keeping the same in mind. The National Eye Donation Fortnight was celebrated from 25th August to 8th September 2020 which saw active participation from medical students and nursing staff. Posters were prepared and displayed, educative pamphlets were distributed to the general public and a webinar on eye donation for all AIIMS faculties was conducted on 8th September 2020.

World Glaucoma Week was celebrated from 7th to 13th March 2021. Screening of patients was carried out at Primary Health Centre (PHC), Jheet, throughout the week. Patient awareness in the form of posters, video presentations, pamphlet distribution were carried out in addition to a Webinar on Glaucoma Awareness by the faculties of the department on 12th March 2021.

EDUCATION

MD Ophthalmology postgraduate seats were increased from 4 to 8 per year during 2020-21 with 3 seats in July 2020 and 5 seats in January 2021. There is routine PG teaching Programme including Departmental Case Presentation, Journal Club and Seminars for better academic atmosphere among PG Junior Residents and Senior Residents. The Department is involved in Clinical Teaching for 4th, 6th & 7th Semesters in the form of Clinics, Tutorials & Lectures (both online and offline) as per schedule.

HIGHLIGHTS

The department of physiology conducted teachinglearning activities, research and contributed towards patient care over the last year. Teaching of MBBS and MD students were held online due to prevailing covid pandemic using FCC platform. Evaluations were also conducted over these platforms using innovative methods. Two MD students passed out of the department with superior grades. Also, faculty delivered lectures in Medical Education towards development of knowledge and skills of institute faculty. In research, faculty presented in several International and National Seminars and conferences, imparting training in workshops. Also, they have been conducting or completed twelve research projects, eight departmental projects including MD thesis and nine collaborative projects with approximately seven different specialties from within and outside AIIMS, Raipur which included aspects of Sickle Cell Disease, chronomedicine, cancer & diabetes research and medical education,

including chapter in book. In addition, the department contributed in terms of Research & patient care during the Covid pandemic along with several publications.In this context, our extensive research on lockdown related effects on Indian population in relation to sleep and behavior yielded international publications with quote in several newspapers. Its effect on medical students was also published and lectures delivered on mental health issues & immunity concerns during covid. Besides, faculty were also involved in sessions to inculcate general awareness on issues such as yoga, mental health of women, effect of social media on medical students, and posters on covid safety concerns. In addition, the faculty, senior and junior residents of the department were extensively involved in Covid screening duties at the institute, cumulatively amounting to 22 postings for upto 200 days while continuing with their teaching and research activities in the department.

EDUCATION

Innovative Educational Activities:

- Laboratory based practical exercises were conducted in online format to facilitate remote learning through observation as series of brief video clippings with explanations. Assessment of both objective and descriptive theoretical knowledge was done online and their answers were evaluated on time.
- MBBS Students were exposed to newer techniques such as USG through which cardiac cycle was demonstrated as a practical.
- Post graduate students were exposed to structured high-end practicals in speciality laboratories i.e. EEG-ERP, Cardio-pulmonary, Autonomic-vascular and EMG-NCV through week long exercises and discussions.
- Novel methods of spot assessment was used using videos and on monitors, while maintaining social distancing as per corona precautions. Evolving assessment methods continued to be used over the year, such as OSPE/OSCE and structured viva in aforesaid modified format.
- Modern assessment tools continued to be used in theory papers i.e. Single and Multiple response, Reason-Assertion and Problem Based MCQs, Structured Long Answer Questions and Short Answer Questions.

- Sensitisation lectures on various aspects of Medical Education were delivered in national fora and to AllMS Raipur faculty by Physiology faculties as resource, under Medical Education Unit, AllMS, Raipur.

HIGHLIGHTS

The department of Radiodiagnosis is now well equipped with all state of the art equipments like, Digital Radiography (1000 mAs DR), Digital radiofluoroscopy (DRF), Doppler USGs, Multidetector CTs (128 slice and 256 slice), Digital Subtraction Angiography, MRI 3 tesla, Digital Mammography system, Digital OPG, Portable X-ray machines, Computed Radiography system. In addition to the infrastructure development, the post graduate MD incumbents in Radiology were 14 by the end of March

2021 with 5 PG incumbents in the current year. The department has one incumbent candidate for postdoctoral certificate course (PDCC) in Cardiothoracic and Vascular Imaging and Interventional Radiology for this year. HIGHLIGHTS

The department is providing state of the art Linear Accelerator based External Beam radiotherapy treatment at our department for various cancer patients. The department is presently treating patients with Elekta Versa HD LINAC system. We are using Volumetric Arc Therapy (VMAT), Intensity Modulated Radiotherapy (IMRT), 3 Dimensional Conformal Radiotherapy (3D CRT), conventional radiotherapy and Electron Beam therapy for patients. The department is performing adjuvant,

postoperative and concurrent chemo-radiotherapy as per indications. The department has also started radiotherapy of the whole bone for intra-operative implantation in patients undergoing limb salvage for bone tumours. Prophylactic cranial irradiation is also being done for Acute Leukemic patients. Palliative radiotherapy is also being delivered to patients with metastatic or locally advanced disease. Post graduate course is already approved by the Academic Council.

EDUCATION

Senior Residents: Hands on training of Senior Resident doctors is being provided for day to day OPD management of cases, handling of Day Care chemotherapy and their side effects. They are specifically being trained for CT Simulation of patients being planned for radiotherapy. They are also being trained about contouring of normal tissues and various tumor volumes on the Treatment Planning System. They are also being trained about various planning modalities like 2D, 3DCRT, IMRT and VMAT. They are also learning medical physics and are being trained in plan evaluation. Besides their routine daily activity they are also involved in departmental academic activities.

Nursing Students: During the posting of nursing student they were taught basics of Oncology and were given practical training on preparation and delivery of cyto-toxic chemotherapy agents to patients with various solid tumors.

HIGHLIGHTS

The Department of Transfusion Medicine and Blood Bank expanded its services with the opening of Blood Storage Center at the Trauma Building with a facility to store all Blood Components (products) including Apheresis platelets. The department shall shortly initiate a therapeutic plasma exchange facility at the premises. The year 2020-21 was a challenging year due to an outbreak of Sars-Cov-2 infection which eventually became a global pandemic. The blood requirements of the Hospital was sustained by its campaign for voluntary donations and organizing 'small events'. HIGHLIGHTS

The School of Public Health (SPH), AIIMS Raipur, successfully entered the second year of its establishment with a fresh intake of 6 candidates in 2020-21. Two students of Batch 2019 i.e., Ms Snehlata and Dr Kritika Vaishnav, won the Kayakalp Appreciation Award for hygiene promotion.

SPH collaborated with the Nephrology department, AIIMS Raipur and State Health Department (CG) to observe World Kidney Day and organized various events for three days (8-9-10 March 2021). The first day included hands-on training on "Prevention of Catheter-Related Bloodstream infection" for all dialysis technicians across the state & the second day comprised a workshop on "Peritoneal dialysis" for HCPs from various districts of

Chhattisgarh. The event concluded on the third day, with an awareness program on "Living well with kidney disease," inaugurated by Prof (Dr) Nitin M Nagarkar; Director & CEO, AIIMS Raipur. Professor (Dr.) Vivekanand Jha, World-renowned Nephrologist & Executive Director, The George Institute for Global Health, India; was the guest of honor. The department also organized a Poster-making competition and indoor games during the event.

Continuing advocacy for covid appropriate behavior, the department organized health promotion activities in the OPD registration area of AIIMS, Raipur, twice a week for patients & their attendants. Advocacy sessions were also organized on World Oral Health Day (20/3/21), World TB Day (22/3/21 & 25/3/21).

EDUCATION

Adhering to the MoHFW curriculum for MPH course, The School of Public Health, AIIMS Raipur, employs various teaching/learning techniques like didactic lectures, seminars, journal clubs, collaborative learning, group discussions, assignments, hands-on training on computers, visit organizations of public health interests, film review, poster making, debates, practical, field projects, public health campaigns, etc. for teaching. MPH course is a two-year course comprising four semesters, 16 modules, one academic research project, and two months internship. There are 12 students currently pursuing MPH in the department, six each in the first and second year. All second-year MPH students are on the verge of completing their research projects, and firstyear students are due to submit their synopsis by June 30, 2021.

In the year 2020-21, 163 lectures, eight guest lectures, 48 seminars, 29 webinars, 31 journal clubs, four field visits, nine health education campaigns have been conducted. There have been seven publications and participation in 2 CMEs by students & faculty of the department.

Guest lectures by the eminent Public Health Experts of Chhattisgarh, i.e., Dr. Kamlesh Jain, Nodal Officer NTCP, NPCDCS, Climate Change, and Dr. Nitin Patil, SMO WHO, were organized for postgraduate students to orient them on challenges and opportunities in public health and prepare them for future endeavors.

D. DEPRECIATION

- Depreciation is provided on written down value of assets. Rate of depreciation has been taken from rates specified in Income Tax Act 1961.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India on the accounts of All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Raipur for the year ended 31 March 2021.

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Raipur as on 31 March 2021, the Income and Expenditure Account and the Receipt and Payment Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers and Conditions of Service) Act, 1971. These financial statements are the responsibility of AIIMS' management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules and Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects etc. if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/ CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluation of the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that;
- (i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- (ii) The Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and the Receipt and Payment Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format approved by the Ministry of Finance.

- (iii) In our opinion, proper books of account and other relevant records have been maintained by AIIMS, Raipur in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- (iv) We further report that: --

A. Balance Sheet

A.1 Sources of Funds

A.1.1 Current Liablities and Provisions (Schedule-7) – ₹ 46.94 crore

- A.1.1.1 This does not include ₹ 187.77 erore being unspent balance of grants-in-aid (excluding interest of grant). This resulted in understatement of Current Liabilities by ₹ 187.77 erore and overstatement of Corpus Fund/Capital Fund by the same amount. This was also pointed out in previous SARs.
- A.1.1.2 This does not include ₹ 18.89 crore¹ being provisions were not made for different expenses pertaining to current year. This resulted in understatement of Current Liabilities and Provisions by ₹ 18.89 crore and understatement of Expenditure by the same amount.
- A.1.1.3 This includes ₹ 71.63 lakh being extra liability created for extramural funds. Since, item no. v(a)- other current liabilities includes ₹ 2,51,30,648 being the liability made specifically for extramural funds instead of ₹ 1,79,67,856 (the actual fund balance available/liability for various extramural funds). This resulted in overstatement of Current Liabilities & Provisions by ₹ 71.63 lakh and understatement of Corpus/Capital Fund by same amount.

A.2 Application of Funds

A.2.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule-8)- ₹ 789.70 crore

- A.2.1.1 The land measuring 50.00 acres at Naya Raipur and 10.00 acres at Village-Umarda, Tehsil-Kurud Disstt-Dhamatari (Chhatisgarh), total a sum of 60.00 acres land has been allotted by the Government of Chhattisgarh to AIIMS Raipur on lease basis, initially for a period of 30 years which has not been accounted for at a nominal value as required under Accounting Standard-12. This was also pointed out in SAR 2016-17 (para A.2.1.7).
- A.2.1.2 This does not include ₹ 16.27 lakh being books purchased under Learning Resource Allowance Scheme for the FY 2020-21. As per the scheme guidelines, these books are the property of AIIMS and therefore, should have

been included in the Fixed Assets. But the same was considered as expenditure. This resulted in understatement of Fixed Assets by ₹ 16.27 lakh and overstatement of Expenditure by ₹ 16.27 lakh as well. This was also pointed out in SAR 2016-17 (Para A.2.1.5).

B. Income and Expenditure

B.1 Expenditure

This includes ₹ 6.92 crore² being expenses pertaining to previous years and booked in current year (no provisioning were made in previous year). This resulted in overstatement of current year Expenditure by ₹ 6.92 crore and understatement of Prior Period Expenditure by same amount.

C. General

Provision of gratuity and other retirement benefits were not made on actuarial valuation basis. This was also pointed out in SAR 2018-19 (Para A.2) and SAR 2019-20 (Para A.2).

Effect of audit comments

The net effect of the above comments is that Liabilities, Assets, Expenditure and Prior Period Expenses were understated by ₹ 1889.00 lakh, ₹ 16.27 lakh, ₹ 1180.73 lakh and ₹ 692.00 lakh respectively.

D. Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Director, All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Raipur through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial/ corrective action.

E. Grants-in-aid

AIIMS, Raipur received grants-in-aid of ₹ 454.00 crore and interest received amounting to ₹ 8.04 crore alongwith internal receipts of ₹ 26.72 crore. In addition to this there was an unspent balance of ₹ 189.59 crore. Unspent balance includes ₹ 65.47 crore interest on GIA upto March 2020 which was refunded in March 2021 and unadjusted advance of ₹ 19.53 crore. Thus out of total available funds of ₹ 612.88 crore an amount of ₹ 430.80 crore was utilized leaving an unutilized balance of ₹ 182.09 crore (including interest on GIA amounting to ₹ 8.04 crore for the FY 2020-21) and there was ₹ 13.73 crore

unadjusted advance. Thus, total unutilized balance of GIA is ₹ 195.82 crore at the end of the year.

- (v) Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and the Receipt and Payment Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- (vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters stated in Annexure to this audit report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:
 - In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Raipur as at 31 March 2021; and
 - b. In so far as it relates to Income and Expenditure Account of deficit, for the year ended on that date.

1 Adequacy of Internal Audit system:

Internal Audit system was found to be inadequate due to:

- No Internal audit manual is in use. This was also pointed out in earlier SAR.
- (ii) Internal audit has not been conducted since 2015.

2 Adequacy of Internal control system:

The internal control system was found tobe inadequate due to:

- 15 paras of compliance audit were still outstanding pertaining to the period from 07/2016 to 12/2020.
- 16 paras of internal audit were still pending.
- (iii) Item wise highest and lowest levels of consumable stock have neither been fixed nor maintained.
- (iv) AIIMS Raipur has no Accounting Manual of its own. This was also pointed out in earlier SAR.
- (v) No HR policy and promotion policy has been prepared. This was also pointed out in earlier SAR.
- (vi) There is no training and development policy in place.
- (vii) Project wise information is not available in compiled mode. Present status of many projects is not updated because data has still to be compiled by collecting information from all the concerned department/principal investigators.
- (viii) There is a printing mistake in the case of capital work in progress section of schedule-8. Instead of 'Capital Work-in-progress during the Year 2020-21', it has been printed 'Capital Work-in-progress during the Year 2019-20'. It needs rectification.
- (ix) The figures in the column of Net Block (As at the Current year end) in Work-in-progress section of schedule 8 is showing an amount of ₹1,12,88,96,711.31. However the bifurcation of the WIP which needed to be depicted is not depicted due to some technical error during transfer of data from excel to pdf. The corrections need to be incorporated.
- (x) As per Schedule-11, bank balances on current accounts is Rs. 1,95,41,57,288.19. But, closing balance in Current Accounts in the payment side of Receipts and Payment Account of 2020-21 is ₹ 1,96,69,10,107.19. The payment side of the Receipts & Payments Accounts (₹ 1,96,69,10,107.19) includes the bank account balance both of current account (₹ 1,95,41,57288.19) and Saving Account balance

(₹1,27,52,819.00) which is reflected in Schedule – 11. The bifurcation of bank balances as balance in current account and balance in saving account needed to done in Receipts and Payments accounts. This bifurcation was not done leading to mismatch in figures.

3 Physical Verification of Fixed Assets:

Physical verification of Fixed Assets has been conducted during the year.

4 Physical Verification of Inventories:

The Physical verification of inventories has been conducted during the year.

5 Regularity in payment of Statutory Dues:

Delay was noticed in the payment of statutory obligations due to heavy rush of work and COVID-19 pandemic in March 2021.
